

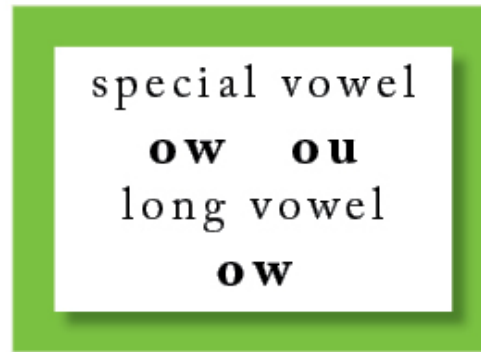
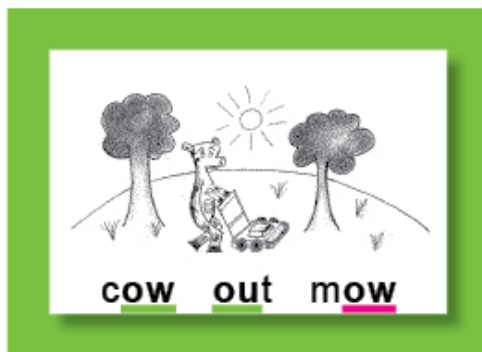
Song Samples

The songs are a fun, integral part of the teaching process when new vowel sounds and rules are introduced. They further serve in aiding memorization and contribute to the enjoyment factor in the learning process. The 23 original songs consist of three types::

1. Songs teaching and reinforcing vowel sounds
2. Songs teaching and reinforcing vowel rules
3. Songs teaching and reinforcing "character counts" qualities in the five short vowel characters

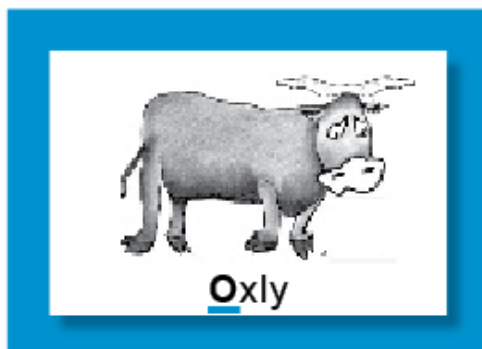
The entire song collection exposes students to varying genres of music: grassroots, jazz, blues, show tunes, etc.

1st Song Sample – **A Cow Out to Mow** helps to teach and reinforce the vowel sounds most commonly associated with the vowel combinations /ow/ and /ou/. The guide words memorized are: **cow out mow** as depicted on the student flashcard.



2nd Song Sample -**WHAT TO DO #1**- helps to teach and reinforce one of the vowel rules in the Voweletics™ Reading Program.

3rd Song Sample – **Here for You** – helps to teach and reinforce the short /o/ vowel sound. **Oxly** demonstrates the "character counts" quality regarding the value of friendship.



The five short vowel characters each represent a certain character quality to which kids can relate. In addition to the lyrics of the songs portraying these qualities; phonetic poems, worksheets and the subsequent reading series, **The Readersville Readers**, allow students to embrace the Voweletics characters and become actively involved in the Voweletics™ Reading Program.
